**Subject:** Release of all FMS Shipments to Lebanon.

**Purpose:** To advise all DoD Agencies and Contractors of the release FMS and BPC (Pseudo FMS) shipments previously suspended from delivery to Lebanon.

**Be Advised:** This Customer Advisory (CA) supersedes CA-12-10/10-0164, CA-11-03/24-0093, CA-11-03/25-0091 and all associated updates.

**Reference:** MSDDC Customer Advisory CA-11-02/15-0041 which states:

“At the Direction of the Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Army for Defense Exports and Cooperation (DASA-DEC) and Commander; United States Army Security Assistance Command (USASAC) all Army FMS shipments being processed and in the transportation pipeline (DTS and Freight Forwarder) are to be suspended effective immediately.”

**The following updated guidance is provided by the DASA-DEC and USASAC CG. No updates to this Customer Advisory will be required.**

Per the DASA-DEC and USASAC CG, the hold on lethal Army FMS shipments to Lebanon has been lifted in accordance with DSCA Memo, February 5, 2013. Per Federal Register / Vol. 77, No. 250, the Department of State no longer requires the Defense Security Cooperation Agency (DSCA) to request an Exception for Export. All Army FMS shipments will process and ship following normal FMS procedures and without exception.
