1. How do I become a government approved Transportation Service Provider (TSP)?

Government approved TSPs are only accepted into our system during an Open Season. There is no Open Season scheduled at the present time. When Surface Deployment and Distribution Command (SDDC) does have an Open Season it will be announced on SDDC's Personal Property website main page. 4. Can SDDC assist with a Transportation Service Provider (TSP) dealing with a carrier that will not pay?

Surface Deployment and Distribution Command (SDDC) is taking a hard look at TSPs to ensure they are financially sound to continue to do business with the Department of Defense (DoD). However, the SDDC does not interfere in disputes between TSPs and their subcontractors/agents. If settlement cannot be made between both parties in question, you may want to seek the advice of an independent attorney to settle this debt.
